2015 Auckland Juniors

We had a team of 9 Swimmers at this years Auckland Juniors. We got a lot of fourth places, with swimmers just missing out on medals, but we did collect the following medals:

Noah Makaea—Silver in the 1 lyrs old 50 Breast

Jesse Tu'inukuafe—Bronze in the 12yrs old 50 Free

We also had Noah, Andrew, Alex and Vienna making New Zealand Juniors times, and Jesse qualifying for Level I. There were a lot of PBs by all swimmers which was great as it was the first time most of the team had swam at this level. Well done team!

2015 Auckland Harbour Crossing

On Saturday 12th December a team of Roskill swimmers got up early and met at



Cameron Pools at 6am ready for their journey over to Quinton Park in Bayswater for the start of the 2015 Auckland Harbour Crossing. Starting at 7.30am, it was a 2.9km course across the Auckland Harbour finishing in the Viaduct. We had a team of 18 young and old taking part. Flynn was the fastest of the Roskill swimmers coming in at 42mins and Samantha was the fastest girl in our team, getting a Bronze medal for the 15yrs and under age group. We also had Alex at the age of 10, the youngest swimmer in the whole event, making the swim across with the help of our club President, Mike Oberdries, who swam with Alex the whole way. Congratulations to Daniel who won a spot prize for his efforts. It was a great day and a great effort from all swimmers young and old.

2015 Auckland Age Groups

Our team of 13 swimmers collected 14 Auckland medals at Auckland Age Groups on the 18th-20th December, finishing 6th overall team in Auckland. There were a lot of PB's after a big month of training.

Day I got off to a good start with the team collecting 4 Auckland Medals with Ori getting Gold in the 50 Fly, Gemma getting Bronze in the 50 Fly, Flynn getting Bronze in the 100 Back and Stella finishing a late night with a Bronze in the 200 IM.

Day 2 followed with another 6 Auckland Medals with Sam getting Bronze in the 100 Fly, Eddie getting Silver in the 100 Fly, Stella getting Bronze in the 100 Fly, Ori getting Gold in the 50 Free and Flynn finishing the morning off with Bronze in the 200 Back and one more medal going to Sam in the 400 IM.

Day 3 got off to a good start with Jesse making a National time in the 100 Free, then we had Sam getting a Silver in the 200 Fly, Stella getting Bronze in the 100 Breaststroke and Silver in the 200 Breast and Flynn getting a Bronze in the 400 Free. Awesome results, well done to all swimmers.

2016 Anthony Mosse Classic

The AMC 2016 got off to a good start for the Roskill Swim Team. Sessions were long with 6hrs of warm up and timed finals, however we managed to pick up 6 medals on Day 1, 17 medals on Day 2 and another 11 on Day 3 bringing the total to 35 medals. Club Meets:

Thank you to everyone who helped at the Level 2 meet we hosted at West Wave on the weekend. It was fantastic to see swimmers, parents and coaches all working together to ensure the meet ran smoothly. Great teamwork everyone!

Roskill have 4 more swim meets to host this year (see club events on page 4). We need all club members to help out with these meets, so please put them in your diary now. These meets are essential for the club to raise much needed funds which benefit all club members. They are also fun and a great opportunity to get to know other club members. If you have any questions about helping out and what is involved please talk to a committee member.

More Officials Needed:

We currently have four parents training as IOTs (Inspector of Turns) and one as a trainee JOS (Judge of Stroke) - these parents are invaluable to us and are helping our club move in the right direction. Officials from IOT's upwards are in short supply within Auckland Swimming and we will not be in a position to run or attend meets without our dedicated parents who go on to become qualified at this level. We have also recently had a few parents signed-off as qualified timekeepers which is fantastic. Our goal is for parents to qualify as timekeepers within a short timeframe of a swimmer making it to Level 2. If you think you have done six timekeeping sessions or more at meets let us know that it is time for you to become qualified and we will sort it! Remember, for you to enter your swimmer into meets it is a requirement that you also assist at meets ... and it is way more fun being where the action is on pool deck, which you can only do if you are swimming, coaching or working as an official. Becoming an official is easy and we will help you with information and training so please take up the challenge to upskill!
